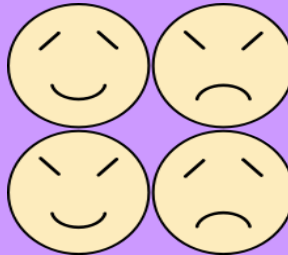

There seems to be more bad days than there are good days in my new

relationship; how do I know when it's time to end it?

There are several factors that should let a person know that the relationship is not going to

work for long. Some are obvious like abuse, infidelity, and dishonesty, but there are factors that are subtle & often go ignored like in their finances, etc. We're told in 1 John 4:1, "Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God...". This is not to say be shallow & allow a person's smallest flaw to end the relationship because no

man is perfect, but don't allow small unresolved problems to fester & become larger problems later. Tackle the problem head on & if there isn't a resolution then ending the relationship might be the best before more time, effort, & emotion is invested into the relationship. Amos 3:3 says, "Do two walk together unless they have agreed to do so?".
